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Message from Mr. Day

Hello Stonybrook Middle School Families!

Welcome to second semester. I hope this newsletter finds you off to a good start in this new year. January has definitely been off to a busy, yet interrupted start. As children we love to hear "snow day" or "2 hour delay" but as adults we know this means many changes to plans that we have in place! But as with so many things in life, we simply learn to appreciate the ins and outs of the unexpected and respond accordingly. Please note that our calendar has been adjusted given the closing and we now go to school through June 4th.

With start of this semester, I met with students through their science classes to share information from the first semester of school with regards to how we at SMS are performing in regards to attendance, academics, and conduct. In short, we have many things to focus on and improve related to these three prongs of school life. I do hope your child has talked with you about this information and my request that as a community, we respond to the needs of our schools.

I am working with my staff to improve our ability to support the ongoing needs of our students. A primary concern are the relationships, whether it is peer to peer, or student to staff. After I presented the information to our students, we then broke into smaller groups and had discussion around 12-15 challenges that have been identified as common issues between our performance and our potential. Students provided wonderful insight that will be shared with the staff as we look to make the improvements.

Additionally, I am creating a student advisory committee called The Red Storm Brigade. I invited students to apply for this committee so that they have an opportunity to serve as a liaison between the student body and the staff. If your child has mentioned this to you, please compliment him/her as this is a step towards being part of the needed solution.

We also had a Family Forum Night on January 10th which had representatives from across the district, some local community organizations and members, as well as a group of parents. We had the wonderful opportunity to hear from Dr. Lori Desautels, a professor of neuroscience from Butler University, as she shared the impact adversity has on the adolescent mind. She provided helpful information on how we, as the adults (home, school, and community), can better respond to our young people who have experienced adverse situations.

There is much more to come on this. Please stay informed and join us in our efforts to better support our students and our community. In the meantime, I hope that you and your family weather the flu season unscathed!

Family Math Night

ISTEP+ - Coming Soon!

We will be testing the week of February 26th for the annual ISTEP+ State Assessment. Please be talking with your child about ensuring their best effort is given on this assessment as the data is used to drive instruction and class placement and interventions. In addition, please look at your calendars for the week of February 26th. If your child has any appointments in the morning, please consider rescheduling those to prevent missing the test and having to miss classes to make up the test.

CORE Quarter - Second Semester Focus

During your child's lunch block, we have a 15 minute period of time where students focus on activities related to our CORE principles. This semester, we have changed the focus up a bit to better assist students. The weekly lineup is below. Please have conversation with your child about these various tasks, the skills they are learning, and how they are implementing this into their daily life.

<u>Mindfulness Mondays</u> – Students are learning strategies to help them regulate their mind, to lower stress levels, and to be in a position to respond to various stressors in life. Ask your child about some of the breathing and movement strategies they are learning.

Typing Tuesday – While many student are proficient at texting skills, they do not have standard typing skills. Students use the 15 minutes to practice their skills. This is something that can be easily done outside of school as well. There are many websites that provide free training.

<u>Wisdom Wednesday</u> – On this day we are teaching students pro-social behaviors to help them navigate social situations successfully.

<u>Tyler Thursday</u> – Students are expected to log into our student information system and write down any missing assignments they may have as well as their current grades. Students are then to ask teachers on Friday any questions related to the missing work, complete it and turn it in on Monday upon return to school. Ask to see your child's form every week. Partnering on this, requiring your child to do their assignments, will assist your child's growth.

<u>Friendship Friday</u> – School, like many aspects of life, is highly dependent on having healthy relationships. The time on Friday is intended for students and staff to get to know each other and build relationships.

News from our Social Worker

Greetings and Happy New Year! As we are now in the winter season, please contact me if you are needing warm coats and gloves for your child. Additionally, if you have gently used coats that you would like to donate for another child, we would be happy to accept donations.

Social Media – Screen Time: A Life Balance

We realize there are many pressures on parents to provide access for their children to electronic devices, specifically cell phones and video games, as well as popular social media apps such as SnapChat and Instagram. While research shows that there are benefits to activities students engage in on these devices, as with many things, there are many negative impacts.

Ongoing research continues to provide evidence correlating the amount of screen time and social media use with increases of a negative impact on school performance as well as social interactions; we need to collectively be aware of the potential unintended impacts that we are having on our children. Monitoring your child's activity on these devices is paramount for both their mental health as well as their physical safety.

We experience many challenging impacts from student's inappropriate use of these apps, some which they are not old enough to legally have – and are commonly on a phone registered to an adult; the use is happening both in and out of school and it is impacting the overall climate at Stonybrook Middle School. When reviewing our academic, attendance, and conduct information, the priority of a student having a cell phone with them during the day – especially when you consider the access to computers – is so low that every parent should be supportive of our efforts to minimize the ongoing issues these devices cause.

Review of our technology policy, which is listed in the Rights and Responsibilities handbook, is currently occurring. As we look at enforcement of this policy, we will be in communication with parents, students, and staff.



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Guidance Corner

Attention 8th Grade Parents: Warren Central High School scheduling process will start on Friday, February 9th. On this day, WCHS counselors will be at SMS discussing a lot of good information about the high school and working with your child on completing their scheduling paperwork.

Students will bring home a copy of the paperwork the following week. Should you want to make any changes to the electives that your child chooses, you may do so and return the paper with your signature by Friday, February 16th to Mrs. Nicholson at SMS. There is no need to return the scheduling paper if you are satisfied with the electives your child selected.

Spotlight on Science



Science at Stonybrook Middle School is always exciting. We began the second nine weeks with an Achieve 3000* reading challenge, not only between the classes at SMS, but we also competed against Creston & Raymond Park. Ms. Hobbs' 1st period class won the SMS competition with an average class score of 87%. This is

12% higher than the expected average!

The 8th graders have finished their chemistry unit and were able to do a few lab activities including elephant toothpaste and penny drop. Ms. Redden's classes have already begun the next unit on physics. The 7th graders have begun the Life Science unit and will be using the microscopes to look at different types of cells. This is always a highlight of the year. Everyone likes looking through the microscope.

Finally, we are helping prepare our students for ISTEP. We are giving them writing prompts and grading them just like the IDOE will. We provide feedback and the students make changes followed by more feedback from us. It is every department's responsibility to help our students become better readers and writers. The science team is committed to helping your child become the best they can be.

Center for Talent Development

Northwestern University's Midwest Academic Talent Search (NUMATS) Advanced assessment that will identify your child's talents and provide the resources you need to develop them. *<u>Achieve 3000</u> is a reading program that is designed to meet your child at his or her current reading level (also referred to as their Lexile score which is a scale used to determine your child's performance relative to his/her age group). It provides differentiated text to then help strengthen your child's reading performance. This resource is available to your child to access at home as well.
