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# Dear Stonybrook Middle School Parents and Guardians:

Welcome to the start of the 2018-19 school year! I hope that you and your family are finding time to relax, make new memories, and connect to one another during the summer break. On behalf of the entire SMS team, I look forward to meeting and working with your son or daughter this year. Since school let out in June, we have been reviewing student performance and setting goals for our performance this coming year. Through a collaborative partnership, we can meet your child's needs and look forward to the growth each child will make! The information in this back-to-school newsletter is to help both you and your child prepare for the transition back to school which starts on Monday, July 30<sup>th</sup>.

For our incoming 7<sup>th</sup> graders, there is often a mixture of excitement and anxiety as they transition to the middle school. For our incoming 8<sup>th</sup> graders, they are excited to be in their final year of school that prepares them for high school. Either way, the transition from the relaxed routines of summer back to the early mornings of school and the discipline required to be a successful scholar can create some challenges. With a few proactive steps, you can help maximize a positive start to the school year for your child. I think you will find the information in this newsletter helpful.

Please take the time to sit down with your child starting about one week prior to school starting that will help your child successfully launch into the 2018-19 school year, prepared for the learning environment. Re-establish healthy school sleeping habits (at least 8 hours per night), eating habits, school appropriate dress code, supplies, and study routines.

A copy of our uniform dress policy, which has been updated for this year, is included in this newsletter for your convenience. Please note that compliance with this dress code is expected on the first day of school.

Please make note of the following information and important dates as the school year approaches:

- The middle school is comprised of grades 7 and 8 and is located on the bottom level of the building. The intermediate academy is comprised of grades 5 and 6 and is located on the upper level of the building. **To avoid the potential confusion of having SMS and SIA in the same building, parents will want to discriminate in reviewing formation connected to Stonybrook and be mindful that the schools have separate offices.** All visitors will enter Door 1 and our staff will be happy to assist you with your specific needs. The main line phone number for SMS is 532-8800.
- Monday, July 30<sup>th</sup>, is the first day of school. SMS wants parents to be involved, but at the same time allow your child to begin the middle school journey in a supported, but independent manner.
- During the first few weeks of school, your child will receive a lot of information. Please review this information with your child to ensure the understanding of the requirements of success at SMS.
- School attendance is a key priority for student success. Arriving to school each day, on-time, ready to learn, will help position your child for a positive and successful start to each day. While it is ultimately the responsibility at this age for the child to get prepared each morning, a defined and enforced routine by the caring adults in the child's life make all the difference. A good night's sleep, healthy food and exercise choices, limiting screen time (including TV and video games on school nights), will contribute to your child's educational experience.
- Learning how to be organized, disciplined, and focused on success, in spite of any challenges one faces, is critical to for students to learn as they advocate for their needs. Please be prepared to help your child stay accountable to writing down assignments, due dates, and monitoring their

performance through our Tyler student information system portal. The student must take an active interest in his or her own success.

- **Personal electronic devices (e.g., phones)** are not permitted in the learning environment. Students are to store these items away as they enter the building, place them in their lockers for the duration of the school day, and not use them until they reach their after school destination.
- **Please join the PTSA** (Parent, Teacher, Student Association) of SMS. Parent participation in his/her child's school has a direct correlation to the child's school success.

I look forward to seeing you on July  $18^{th}$ , from 12:00 PM - 8:00 PM during our registration day as well as August  $8^{th}$  at our Back-to-School Night. Additional information regarding registration is in this newsletter. Additional Back-to-School Night information will be sent home during the first week of school.

# Athletics

#### <u>Football</u>
