Call to Order/Welcome - Nancy O'Bryan

- Patrick Bryant brought snacks
- Minutes approved with removal of Stan Kwiatkowski as being present from September meeting
- Jenn has sent September meeting minutes to Patrick Jendraszak for publishing published

Principal's Update - Elizabeth Kissel and Dan Heslin

- Nick LeRoy at next School Commission Meeting
- NWEA test that shows growth over time and potential growth, as opposed to ISTEP
 - o Kissel did workshop with staff on how to read the data
 - Helped students get a jump start on what differentiated levels to place children at beginning of the year where in the past they would have had to have waited for Oct/Nov
 - NWEA adjusts questions based on how students are answering questions. Keeps adjusting
 questions until a student is scoring approximately 50% right vs 50% wrong (this is how the
 growth and potential growth is measured)
 - RIT is the measurement 2nd to 8th grade, you can watch the same score fluctuate from test to test for the same child
 - Allows for teachers to better created individual growth plans for their students
 - o Growth scores in math are the current primary area of focus for the school
 - o Rooney foundation helping analyze the data
- St Luke received a 'B' rating 88.9%
 - Taking ISTEP state mapping of questions, NWEA scores and partnering with Rooney foundations to best adjust curriculum to improve ISTEP scores and overall school rating
- Technology
 - o Teachers are embracing the use of it in their curriculums
 - Administration trying to show ways through social media that it is being used in practice, sharing these ideas and examples between the teachers, with parents, etc.
 - o Technology Infrastructure Update
 - 19 new hot spots added

- Teachers still don't have full access to their internet teachers and students are kicked out regularly through the day, email was sporadic
- Vendor we have been working with is Net Excellence
- · 48 hours technology issues should be fixed
- Lots of discussion generated from this topic school resourcing on selection committee, providing up front requirements, long term technology support needs, vendor accountability, etc.
- In general, Kissel, "Feels the right pieces are at St Luke currently, help is needed it get it in the right
 order and put it together going forward."
