The fourth stage of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is called "mystagogy," from the Greek words meaning "to lead through the mysteries." This period extends throughout the Easter season, until the feast of Pentecost. As new Catholics, it takes time for adults to discover the beauty and significance of participating in the sacramental mysteries of the Church. The newly baptized are called "neophytes," from the Greek words meaning "new plant." Neophytes begin their new life of faith with enthusiasm, but they have much more to learn about the Catholic faith and their identity Catholic Christians. They need the ongoing support of their Church community so that their newly planted faith may grow and deepen.
