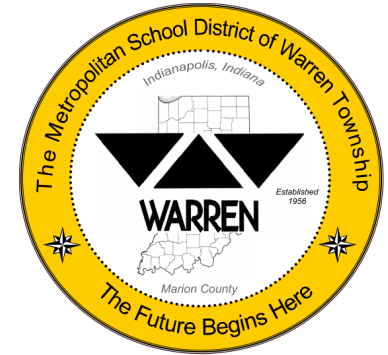
Where are we going?



MSD Warren is seeking an operating referendum in the amount of \$5 million dollars a year for 8 years on the May 8th Ballot.

“For the eight (8) calendar years immediately following the holding of the referendum, shall the Metropolitan School District of Warren Township, Marion County, Indiana, impose a property tax rate that does not exceed twenty-one cents (\$0.2100) on each one hundred dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation and that is in addition to all other property taxes imposed by the school corporation for the purpose of paying a portion of the costs incurred in connection with (a) transporting students, (b) continuing and expanding activities, initiatives and programs related to teacher retention, professional development and special assignment, (c) continued 1:1 technology programs, (d) safety and security programs, and (e) other various student learning, college and career readiness and enrichment programs and opportunities?”

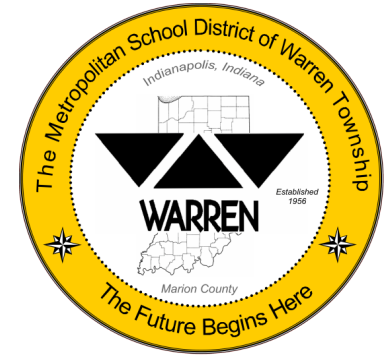

- Protecting Property Values and Taxpayer Investment

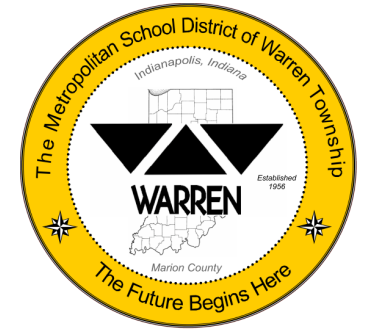
