Warren Central and Walker Career Center have so much to celebrate this semester. To begin the year, the schools were notified that they earned a B rating from the State. This rating is a reflection of the hard work and dedication of our students and staff. Graduation rate, workplace certifications, AP exams, dual credits, and standardized testing are all components of this grade.

Our fall athletes completed successful seasons, and we now move on to winter sports and activities.

This fall, hundreds of our students demonstrated in a positive manner what can happen when young people unify to make a difference in our community. These students joined each other for a peace walk in Washington Park. Organized by WeLIVE Indy, a youth led group whose goal is to end youth gun violence in the city of Indianapolis, the students called for peace in the streets. WeLIVE Indy was founded by Warren Central senior Brandon Warren. WeLIVE is an acronym for, Linked to Intercept Violence Everywhere.

Walker Career Center and Warren Central hosted a College & CareerFest in November. This event featured over 30 colleges and 40 career opportunities for students. This event was traditionally in February, but it was moved to the fall to allow students an opportunity to view course options before scheduling begins in the spring. Walker, which offers more than 20 different career programs from Cosmetology to Welding, hosts this event annually.

We encourage all our parents and guardians to join our PTSA. Our PTSA is a very connected and active group of staff and student supporters. We encourage you to join us at meetings that are hosted on the fourth Tuesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. in our Mediaplex building.

From Homecoming activities to competitions to performances, our students and sponsors have stayed busy giving back to our school and our community. Already this year, the students and staff raised over 12,000 food items for Sonny Day. They were excited and eager to host



their annual Christmas party which served Warren Township elementary students this past December.



ADULT & CONTINUING EDUCATION

The doors of opportunity are always open at Adult & Continuing Education in Warren Township!

Warren Township Adult Education was awarded a grant to offer innovative Integrated Education and Training (IET) certification classes. These classes pair an academic teacher with a subject matter expert to support learners who want to improve their academic skills and/or attain their High School Equivalency (HSE) degree at the same time they are learning skills for an industry-recognized certification in a high-demand field. The IETs that have run since July 1, 2017, are: Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS), and Certified Logistics Associate (CLA). In addition, Warren Township Adult Education is

developing a Skills, Tasks, and Results Training (START) culinary/hospitality certification as well as a Child Development Associate (CDA) certification.

Warren Adult Education is also partnering with Vincennes University to offer Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) and Dental Assistant certification classes. These classes will be offered on site at the Walker Career Center beginning February 2018.

This summer Warren Adult Education joined a partnership with Employ Indy and Goodwill Industries in the Generation Works grant. This pilot grant, which is currently running in only five cities across the nation, enables Warren Adult Education to offer wrap-around supportive services to 16 – 29 year-old learners in our IET classes to ensure their success in attaining their HSE, obtaining certification, and entering and retaining employment.

This partnership enables Warren Adult Education to hire a career coach to follow learners one-on-one for up to two years following their successful certification.

In addition to the existing 12 sites where classes are offered, Warren Township Adult Education was invited into two new locations to offer classes. Warren began offering high school equivalency classes at the Indianapolis Urban League on November 28.

These classes assist learners in attaining the academic skills necessary to enter certification training, as well as pass their HSE. Warren also began offering ESL classes at Hoosier Gasket Corporation on November 28. Hoosier Gasket graciously invited Warren into their facility to assist their employees with English language acquisition.

These are both exciting opportunities for our community!

Warren Adult Education also has many continuing education opportunities. And lastly, Warren's Program of Adult & Continuing Education is well known for its outstanding program of driver education.
