

Job Description —Weekend and Holiday Support Staff (Equine Program)

TITLE: STATUS: REPORTS TO:	Equine/Barn Care Team Member As Needed/Contract Labor Equine Program Manager
GENERAL FUNCTION:	Manage care of horses and barn when the facility is closed (i.e. weekends and holidays)
REQUIRED EXPERIENCE:	3+ years of experience with horses; prior experience with stable care or management preferred

PREREQUISITE SKILLS:

- Should have working equine knowledge and should demonstrate comfort and confidence around horses.
- Ability to detect illness/injury in a horse and ability to interpret equine behavior.
- Ability to blanket, halter, and lead horses independently.
- Ability to problem-solve without direct supervision

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

The following functions describe the essential duties of this role. Other additional related duties may be assigned from time to time.

- 1. Independently manage horse/barn care, including daily tasks such as feeding, cleaning and bedding stalls, turnout, cleaning/filling water buckets, horse health care, and sweeping barn aisles
- 2. Demonstrate horsemanship skills and equine knowledge. Team members should be able to interact with horses independently and with confidence.
- 3. Effectively communicate with Equine Program Manager regarding any daily changes such as feed, medications, turnout groups, weather contingencies, etc.
- 4. Recognize veterinary emergencies, and notify Equine Program Manager and veterinarian promptly.

PHYSICAL/ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS:

Ability to lift up to 70 lbs.

- Ability to work safely around horses.
- Ability to work in cold or hot weather environments.
- Ability to sustain frequent standing, walking, bending (forward and sideways), grasping, twisting at the waist, squatting, kneeling.

ORGANIZATION OVERVIEW:

Located in Carmel, Indiana, The Children's TherAplay Foundation is a not-for-profit outpatient pediatric rehabilitation clinic providing physical and occupational therapies for children with special needs. We incorporate the movement of horses (through a treatment strategy known as *hippotherapy*) as a therapeutic tool during physical and occupational treatments.
