SCHOOL DISTRICT PUBLICA-TIONS/NEWS MEDIA USE FOR STUDENTS

Birthday Treat Policy: Starting this 18/19 school year, all MSD Warren Schools will be aligning their birthday celebration policies to the district's wellness policy. As part of

our efforts towards health and wellness, we follow a "no birthday treats" guideline. Warren Townships policy emphasizes on academics and fairness to all children. Birthday treats and party items are not allowed during school hours. Please do not send food items or party invitations to school. Also, balloons and flowers are not to be delivered to students at school.

Weekly Counselor Digest:



• According to a report from the department of education: "Chronic absenteeism may prevent children from reaching early learning milestones." Continue to focus on coming to school with your student by helping them identify what they look forward to at school: friends, teachers, lunch, recess, and more!

• The counseling office has been very busy with sending out weekly social skill videos, talk to your student about what they see on the morning news! This week's skill was "getting attention appropriately" and next week's lesson will be "how to make good decisions."

• Remember grief support is available to your student if you would like more information on that - please reach out to me

• Activity to try at home: with your family, sit down (maybe over dinner) and encourage your student to openly discuss how they feel... model the use of feeling words like; happy, mad, sad, lonely, silly, etc... afterwards talk to your student about why it is important to identify how they feel.
