


Hello Lakeside Parents and Guardians,

I want to take an opportunity to recap some of the great things that have gone on in the counseling office this year! I have so enjoyed getting to know your students and working with them in a variety of ways. From lessons in the classroom, social skill groups, individual check-ins, and being able to support them as they go through tough times, just to name a few... I have loved every minute. As a reminder, my position is brand new to the district as of this year and we have grown together as a school staff and community so much already. As a school counselor, I have loved teaching your students about their brains, emotions, positive coping skills, respect, kindness, and how to stand up against bullying and moreover how to identify bullying! I am so excited for all of the end of year opportunities that are coming your way!

A couple points or interest:

- Healing Hearts Grief Groups are not accepting new students this year, but recommendations can be considered for next year!
- How can parents help students remember things learned in school?
 - Take some time to go over your child's day...require your student to say something more than "good".
 - Ask if anyone came into their room today.
 - Take a moment to review CORE expectations: Civility, Order, Respect, & Excellence.
 - Ask them what coping skills they used today, how did that help them stay out of dino brain! Remem ber dino brain is the part of the brain that is responsible for when we get upset/angry.
 - Talk about what it means to be there for each other, and how we can keep ourselves safe.
