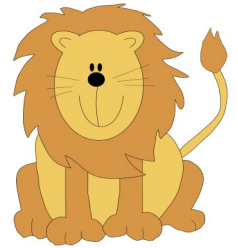

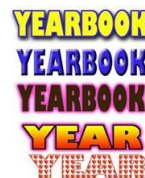
## **\*\*ATTENTION 4TH GRADE PARENTS\*\*** **Human Growth and Development Videos**

**Cold or Flu?**

'Tis the season for cold, flu, and other viruses and to help you tell the difference between the cold and flu, here are some signs and symptoms for each:

**COLD**

- Slow onset of symptoms
- No fever or mild fever
- Mild fatigue
- No headache/body aches
- Normal appetite
- No chills

\*\*Children may also have nausea and vomiting with the flu

**FLU**

- Sudden onset of symptoms
- High fever
- Severe fatigue
- Headache/body aches
- Decreased appetite
- Chills



Some bacterial illnesses also have symptoms that can look like the cold or the flu. Contact your family doctor if you think you or your child may have the flu or a bacterial infection. **Your child may return to school when symptom free or fever free for 24 hours (fever free without using fever reducing medications to keep the fever down) and if they feel well enough to participate in all activities.**
