*I Corinthians 1: 3-9*

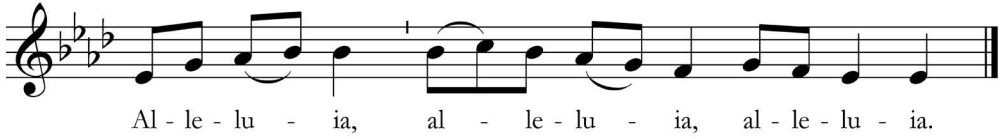
Brothers and sisters:

your faith has saved you.”




